REVISION OF PAY SCALES SCHEME OF BASIC
PAY SCALES AND FRINGE BENEFITS OF THE AZAD
JAMMU & KASHMIR GOVERNMENT EMPLOYEES (1983).

Sdr,

I am directed to state that the President, Azad Jammu & Kashmir has been pleased to sanction, with effect from 1st July, 1983, a Scheme, as detailed below, of the Basic Pay Scales, Allowances and other Fringe Benefits, 1983, for the employees of the Azad Government of the State of Jammu & Kashmir.

PART I: BASIC SCALES AND ALLIED MATTERS.

2. Basic Scales of Pay: The Basic Scales of Pay, 1983, as shown in Annexure I to this letter shall replace the existing Revised National Pay Scales.

3. Fixation of Pay in Basic Scales: The initial pay of an existing Government servant, i.e. an employee who has been in Government service since before the 1st July, 1983, shall be fixed at the stage in the relevant Basic Pay Scales (i.e. the Basic Scale that Annexure corresponds to the Existing Revised National Pay Scale in Annexure I) which is as many stages above the minimum as the stage occupied by him above the minimum of the existing Revised National Pay Scale, provided that where the pay so determined does not give the employee concerned a minimum advantage of 10 per cent of his existing basic pay plus Dearness Allowance over and above the present emoluments drawn by him, his pay shall be fixed at the lowest stage in the Basic Scale that gives him that advantage; provided further that the maximum of the relevant Basic Scale shall not be exceeded in any case. In this fixation formula, "emoluments" would mean the sum of pay, Dearness Allowance and Local Compensatory Allowance, if any.

4. Annual Increment: Annual increment shall continue to be admissible, subject to existing conditions, on the Tat of December each year under this Scheme. However, the first annual increment of existing employees in the Basic Scales shall accrue on the Tat of December, 1983.

5. Move-over: (1) The existing provisions regulating the concession of move-over without promotion to the next higher pay scale of employees in Revised National Pay Scale 1 (B-1), to Revised National Pay Scale 16 (B-16) shall continue to be applicable in this Scheme.

(1A) The existing concession of 'Move-over' of employees from Revised National Pay Scale 16 (B-16) to Revised National Pay Scale 17(B)-17 and Revised National Pay Scale 17(B-17) to Revised National Pay Scale 18(B-18) shall be extended upto B-20 and regulated as under:-

- (a) The existing conditions of the period of stay of three years at the maximum of pay scales B-16 and B-17 in the case of non-technical and non-professional categories shall continue to be applicable.
- (b) No move-over beyond B-16 in the case of the categories of employees mentioned at (a) above shall be permissible.
- (c) The move-over in the case of technical and professional categories, e.g. Doctors, Engineers, Educationists, Economists, Management Accountants, Scientists, Archaeologists, Geologists, Meteorologists, experts of Agriculture, Animal Husbandry and Forestry, shall be permissible upto B-20 without the condition of stay at the maximum for three years.
- (d) Move-over shall be allowed in cases where an employee, who is otherwise considered fit for promotion to higher post, cannot be promoted for want of a vacancy.
- (e) Normal promotion procedure as is observed in cases of promotion through the competent authority shall be followed in the move-over to Basic Scales 19 and 20.

6. (A) Modification of Scales in case of certain posts:

(a) In the case of posts shown in column 1 of Annexure-II, the Basic Scales indicated against each in column 3 shall be allowed instead of the Basic Scales corresponding to their existing Revised National Pay Scales.

(b) In the case of posts of artisans, such as Carpenters, Welders, etc., and Storekeepers, which require different level of expertise and responsibilities in different organizations appropriate Basic Pay Scales may, with the approval of the competent authority, be allowed in different organizations or even in the same organization while taking into account the market value of such artisans and their level of competence.

(B) Fixation of Pay in cases under (A) above: In cases

corresponds to the Revised National Pay Scale have been allowed, initial fixation of pay of the employee concerned shall first be made in the Basic Scale corresponding to his existing Revised National Pay Scale in the light of the fixation of pay formula mentioned in para 3 above, and thereafter his pay in the higher Basic Scale shall be fixed in the next higher stage.

7- Special pays:-(a) The existing special pays admissible to officials of various categories working in Private Secretariats and Personal Assistant shall be revised as under:-

PART II / ALLOWANCES

8. 1) Dearness Allowances, Local Compensation Allowance and Rest & Recreation Allowance: As from 1st of July, 1983, following allowances shall cease to be admissible to a Government servant who draws pay in the Basic Pay Scale:-

- (a) Dearness Allowances sanctioned in this department's letter No. ID/41/7-1205-1205/81 dated the 15th July, 1981 and No. ID/7906-7976/82 dated the 11th July, 1982.
- (b) Local Compensation Allowance, where admissible, sanctioned in this department's letter No. ID/5253-5304/77 dated the 25th May, 1977.
- (c) Rest and Recreation Allowance sanctioned in this Department's letter No. ID/II/1129-1229/77 dated the 10th August, 1977.

ii) All other existing allowances shall continue to be admissible at the existing rates and under the existing rules and orders.

9. Entertainment Allowance: Entertainment Allowance shall be admissible at the following fixed rates to officers drawing pay in B - 20 to B - 22:-

1) B-20	Rs. 400/- p.m.
2) B-21	Rs. 450/- p.m.
3) B-22	Rs. 650/- p.m.

10. Non-practicing Allowance: The existing rates of non-practicing Allowance shall be revised as under:-

Doctors drawing pay in B=17 and
B = 10.

Rs. 500/- p.m.

Doctors drawing pay in B = 19
and above.

be Rs. 700/- p.m.

This allowance shall also be admissible to doctors working on administrative and Secretariat posts. Any other order issued in this behalf shall be deemed to have been withdrawn with effect from 1st July, 1983.

All other existing rules/orders regulating the admissibility of Non-Practicing Allowance shall continue to be in force.

11. Practice Compensatory Allowance: Doctors posted in rural areas below Town Committee level, and allowed private practice, shall be allowed Practice Compensatory Allowance at the following rates:-

a) Male doctors Rs. 200/- p.m.

b) Female doctors Rs. 500/- p.m.

12. Science Teaching Allowance: (a) Secondary School Teachers who hold a Bachelor's degree in basic/natural sciences (including Mathematics) and teach basic/natural science subjects shall be allowed Science Teaching Allowance at the rate of Rs. 100/- p.m.

b) Junior Instructors in Polytechnic Institutes who possess Technical Teachers Diploma shall be allowed Technical Teaching Allowance at the rate of Rs. 100/- p.m.

13. Charge Allowance: Charge Allowance to principals of Colleges and Polytechnic Institutes shall be admissible at the following rates:-

a) Principals of Degree Colleges/ College of Technology, Rs. 200/- p.m.

b) Principals of Intermediate Colleges/Polytechnic Institutes. Rs. 100/- p.m.

14. Warden Allowance: Teachers who are assigned the duty of Hostel Wardens in Colleges and Polytechnic Institutes shall be allowed a Warden Allowance of Rs. 100/- p.m.

15. Advanced Increments to School Teachers on attaining higher qualifications: Primary, Middle and High School Teachers who possess or acquire while in service

1. PRIMARY SCHOOLS

- 1) A teacher who possesses or acquire F.A/F.Sc. shall be allowed two advance increments.
- 2) A teacher who (in addition F.A/F.Sc) also possesses or acquire C.T. shall be allowed one additional advance increment.
- 3) A teacher who possesses or acquires a degree of B.A/B.Sc shall be allowed three additional advance increments.

II. MIDDLE SCHOOLS:

A teacher who possesses or acquires a degree of B.A/B.Sc, shall be allowed three advance increments.

III. HIGH SCHOOLS:

A teacher who possesses or acquires Master's degree shall be allowed three advance increments. In case of a teacher who possesses or acquires Master's degree in Education (M.Ed) and also a Master's degree in any academic subject shall be allowed advance increments.

Provided that a Primary, Middle or High School teacher, as the case may be, who has already drawn increments for possessing higher educational qualifications shall be allowed increments equal to shortfall in the number of increments, if any, between the increments drawn by him and the increments which have now been prescribed.

16. Advance Increments to Technical and Professional Categories on possessing/acquiring higher qualifications
 Doctors, Engineers, Educationists, Economists, Management Accountants, Scientists, Geologists, Metrologists, Archiologists, Experts in Agriculture, Animal Husbandry and Forestry, working in universities, Colleges, Research Institutions or Technical Departments shall be allowed advance increments on possessing/acquiring higher qualifications as under:-

- 1) In case a technical/professional employee of the above category possesses D.Sc/Ph.D degree from a foreign University, he shall be allowed six advance increments on entry into service in B.I.Y.

(11) Those of the above categories of employees who while in service obtain additional shall be allowed four increments in case of (1) above and two advanced increments in case of (11) above.

Provided that if a Government servant belonging to the above mentioned categories has already drawn advance increments for possessing or acquiring the higher qualifications indicated in (1) and (II) above, he shall be allowed increments equal to shortfall in the number of increments, if any, between the increments already drawn by him and the increments being sanctioned now.

17. The orders contained in para 16 above shall not affect any other instructions regarding grant of advance increments already in force before the 1st July, 1963. All such instructions shall continue to be applicable unless amended or rescinded by the competent authority.

18. Design Allowance: Engineers holding University degrees in engineering and working full time in the Design Offices shall, in lieu of the existing special pay, if any, be allowed a Design Allowance at the following rates:

- I) Engineers drawing pay
In B = 17 Re. 400/- p.m.

II) Engineers drawing pay
In B = 18 Re. 450/- p.m.

III) Engineers drawing pay
In B = 19 Re. 500/- p.m.

IV) Engineers drawing pay
In B = 20 Re. 600/- p.m.

19. Daily Allowance : The pay limits for admissibility of Daily Allowance notified vide the Department's Letter No: FD/0000-0150/82 dated 14.7.1982 shall be revised as under:-

20. (a) Cost of Blood Transfusion: The cost of Blood transfusion shall henceforth be reimbursable to the Government employees and their families in accordance with the procedure laid down for reimbursement of cost of medicines, etc.
- (b) Definition of "Family": The word "family" for the purpose of medical treatment shall also include parents of the Government servant residing with and dependent on him.
21. Encashment of Leave Preparatory to Retirement: At present encashment of Leave Preparatory to Retirement upto six months is permissible to Government servants provided the Leave Preparatory to Retirement is refused by Government in Public interest. Henceforth, the option for encashment of Leave Preparatory to Retirement shall rest with the Government servant concerned. In case of Government servant ^{not} opting to take Leave Preparatory to Retirement he shall be allowed leave salary for the period for which Leave Preparatory to Retirement is admissible subject to a maximum of six months.
22. General: All existing rules and orders on the subject shall be deemed to have been modified to the extent indicated above. All existing rules and orders not so modified shall continue to be in force under this scheme. Amendments to the relevant rules, incorporating the above provisions, and new rules regarding revision of Pay scales, shall be issued later.
23. The additional amount required in this behalf shall be provided in Revised Estimates 1903-04. Financial implementation in the enclosed proforma (Annexure III) may kindly be furnished to this Department before 1st October, 1903 positively.

Sir,

I am directed to refer to this Department's letter
F.N.PD/R-No.FD/8748-8808/83 dated the 29th August, 1983 on the subject
noted above and to say that some doubts have been expressed
about the application of certain provisions of the letter in
question. Relevant provisions of the letter under reference are
clarified in the following paragraphs in order to put the
matter beyond any doubt.

I-Paragraph 5: Move- Over.

2. The technical and professional categories of
Government servants, e.g. Doctors, Engineers, Educationists,
Economists, Management Accountants, Scientists, Archaeologists,
Geologists, Meteorologists, Experts of Agriculture, Animal
Husbandry and Forestry, etc. have been allowed to move-over
upto Basic Pay Scale-20 without the condition of staying at
the maximum for 3 years.

3. Since the move-over does not constitute actual
promotion to a higher post carrying higher Basic Pay Scale,
the incidence of move-over should not be notified. The
Government servant concerned shall be allowed to move-over
to the next higher Basic Scale with effect from 1st December
of the year following the year in which he reaches the
maximum of his Basic Pay Scale as laid down in rule 8 (1) of
the Azad Jammu & Kashmir Civil Servants Pay Revision Rules,
1977 in the case of move-over of employees in Pay Scales 1 to
15.

II-Paragraph 13: Charge Allowance.

4. Charge Allowance is admissible at the rate of
Rs. 200/- per month to the Heads of all the institutions,
which award degrees or diplomas equivalent to a Bachelor's
degree and at the rate of Rs. 100/- per month to the Heads

of Institutions that award diplomas or certificate equivalent to an Intermediate Certificate.

III-Paragraph 15: Advance increments to School Teachers on attaining higher qualifications.

5. A number of teachers in different categories were drawing pay at the maximum of their pay scales on 1st July, 1983 and their pay has also been fixed at the maximum of their respective Basic Pay Scales. Such teachers would be deprived of the benefit of advance increments sanctioned in the Scheme of Basic Pay Scales even if they possessed the higher qualifications for which advance increments have been allowed. It has been decided that such teachers, who could not get the full benefit of advance increments provided for in the Scheme of Basic Pay Scales, shall be allowed the benefit of advance increments, if any, which they could not get on 1st July, 1983, in the next higher pay scale after their move-over to that pay scale with effect from the date of move-over to that pay scale with effect from the date of move-over under paragraph 5 of this Department's letter No. FD/8748-8800/83 dated the 29th August, 1983 read with paragraph 3 of this letter.

6. For the purpose of grant of advance increments for higher qualifications to the teachers, B.Com and other academic qualifications equivalent to B.A/B.Sc, shall be treated at par with B.A/B.Sc and N.Com/ other qualification equivalent to M.A/M.Sc shall be treated at par with M.A/M.Sc,

7. Government servants belonging to the cadre of Headmasters/Headmistresses of high Schools would also be entitled to advance increments as admissible to other high school teachers for possessing higher qualifications provided that they were not appointed to the cadre by initial recruitment on the basis of qualifications for which advance increments have been sanctioned.

IV. Paragraph 16: Advance increments to Technical and Professional categories on possessing/acquiring higher qualifications.

8. Advance increments are admissible only to the professional and technical employees drawing pay in Scale B-17.

9. A number of technical and professional employees were drawing pay at the maximum of NPS-17 on 1st July, 1983 and their pay has also been fixed at the maximum of Basic Pay Scale-17. Such Government servants would be deprived of the benefit of advance increments sanctioned in the scheme of Basic Pay Scales even if they possessed the higher qualifications for which advance increments have been

allowed. It has been decided that such technical and professional employees, who could not get the full benefit of advance increments provided for in the Scheme of Basic Pay Scales, shall be allowed the benefit of advance increments, if any, which they could not get on 1st July, 1983, in Scale B-18 after their move-over to that pay scale with effect from the date of move-over under paragraph 5 of this Department's letter No.FD/8748-8808/83 dated the 29th August, 1983 and No.FD/9003-9060/83 dated the 31st August, 1983 read with paragraph 3 of this letter.

V-Paragraph 21: Encashment of Leave preparatory to Retirement.

10. A Government servant who desires to get the benefit of encashment of IPR upto a period of six months must(a) submit his written option to do so at least three months before the date of commencement of his leave preparatory to retirement, and(b) surrender the whole leave preparatory to retirement due to him.

11. The condition mentioned at (a) in para 10 above is not applicable to the Government servants who were due to proceed on IPR before the 29th August, 1983 or whose IPR is due to commence within a period of three months from the date of issue of this letter. The following provisions would govern the cases of such Government servants:-

- a) A person whose IPR was due to commence on or before the 29th August, 1983 but he did not proceed on IPR would be deemed to have exercised his option for encashment of IPR. However, the actual period of leave for the purpose of encashment will be counted from 1st July, 1983.
- b) A government servant who proceeded on IPR on or before the 29th August, 1983 would be deemed to have exercised his option to proceed on IPR. Thus he is not entitled to claim encashment of IPR by getting the un-expired IPR cancelled.
- c) The Government servants whose IPR is due to commence within a period of three months from the date of issue of this letter may exercise their option any time before the commencement of IPR.

VI-Seriesl No.4 under the heading Police Department. in Annexure-II Basic Pay Scale of Sub-Inspector.

12. The minimum qualification of Graduation laid down for admissibility of Scale B-11 is applicable to the Sub-Inspectors who are appointed by initial recruitment. The Sub-Inspectors of Police appointed by promotion are entitled to Scale B-11 irrespective of whether they are Graduates or

not.

VII-Serial Nos 4 and 5 under the heading 'All Government Departments' in Annexure-II: Selection Grade of Stenographers,

13. The existing entries in the last column against serial Nos. 4 and 5 under the heading 'All Government Departments' shall be substituted by the following:-

"B-15

Rs. 900-55-2000

with Selection Grade in B-16(Rs. 1050-80-2250). The posts of Senior Scale Stenographers are merged with the posts of Personal Assistants. The number of selection Grade posts will be 25% of their combined strength minus the number of posts of Private Secretaries in Scale B-16"
